Create a webpage to introduce southern wood ants based on the following description and example.

You can find the text of the page in file *hangya.txt*. The pictures required for the solution of the exercise are *boly.jpg*, *hangyakep.gif*, *vorosh.jpg*.

1. Create file *index.html*.
2. The background colour of the page is orange, colour with code #F09838 and the text colour is brown, colour with code #A03028, except for the cases where the exercise gives a different colour for a text unit.
3. Create the skeleton of the page using a table in accordance with the example. The table width is 800 points, it has two columns and it is without border. (Choose the number of rows, the possibly required cell mergers properly). The cell padding and the cell margin are both 0 and the background colour is light yellow, colour with code #FFECC0.
4. The width of the left column of the table should be 150 points.
5. Insert picture *hangyakep.gif* in four copies one under the other into the left column and align them centered.
6. Copy the text from file *hangya.txt* into the right column of the table.
7. The font size of the title "Southern wood ant" is large, it is bold and aligned centered. The text of the title appearing in the header of the browser should be the same.
8. In the first paragraph, convert word "anthills" into a link that points at picture *boly.jpg*.
9. After the first paragraph, insert picture *vorosh.jpg* and align it centered.
10. Move the text "Did you know it?" and the consecutive paragraph that are located at the end of the source text forward according to the example. In its new place the text should appear in the middle, aligned centered in a box whose width is 300 points and whose background colour is the same as that of the page. The colour of the text in the box is light yellow, colour with code #FFECC0 everywhere. The style of paragraph "Did you know it?" should be Heading 2.

   	<h2 style="color: #A03028;">Southern wood ant</h2> <p style="font-size: small;">Southern wood ant or horse ant is a common insect in coniferous forests. They live in huge, organised groups, colonies, <a href="#">anthills</a>. In most cases they create their nest from pine-needles but it may contain other plant debris as well.</p>  <p style="font-size: small;">Southern wood ant is also called biting ant. Due to their small size their bite is not dangerous but one is advised against sitting on their nest. If several members of the disturbed colony bite you simultaneously, then the itching feeling of the injected formic acid can be quite unpleasant. They can squirt the secretion that contains 50 to 60 % of formic acid as far as 30 cm.</p> <div style="background-color: #F09838; color: white; padding: 5px; text-align: center;"> <p style="margin: 0;"><b>Did you know it?</b></p> <p style="margin: 0; font-size: x-small;">Small ants can lift objects that are twenty times heavier than their own body.</p> </div> <p style="font-size: x-small;">Every colony contains one queen that lays the eggs. Most ants are female workers (4 to 9 mm). These build the nest, search for nutrients, keep the nest clean, fight against the enemy and nurse the larvae.</p>
